Issues of governance of the Alliance

• Alliance new memberships and "withdrawal" of some publishers members

Revision of the Alliance's membership application form: inclusion of supplementary membership criteria (catalogue, publishing relevance in relations to other publishers members), complementary to the classic presentation of publishers on the current membership form; reflexion on the "independent creation publisher" (does this criteria exist, or must it be a determinant?); review of the membership process (steps to the membership process to be added on the membership form).

Who are the new members in the various language networks over the last three years? What are the membership applications currently being processed? Are they validated? Who are the "new" publishers to be approached and/or engaged with to develop and reenergise the language networks?

At what stage is the withdrawal procedure of some inactive publishers in the various language networks? *All coordinators present a report on membership and withdrawals in their respective network over the last three years.*

• Reflexions on an organisation in thematic networks

In fact, the Alliance increasingly works according to a thematic organisation (meeting on digital publishing; youth literature publishers groups; and workshops on African languages) even if the language network logic is no less relevant in some cases (amongst others, in the Spanish-language and English-language networks). This trend brings us to question the organisation in thematic networks that could be complementary to the one in language networks. Is this re-organisation advisable? Would the ICIP need a "new" configuration, enabling a linguistic and thematic representation?

• The Alliance in numbers!

After 10 years of existence, and during this Assembly, how can we quantify the meaning of the Alliance (and therefore the allies) in the publishing landscape? These data, essential to a precise global view of the Alliance, would be very representative, for our partners, of what the Alliance has built over the past 10 years.

What quantitative data need to be collected ahead of the 2014 Cape Town meeting?

- The number and typology of books published by allies;
- Their combined economic weight;
- Overarching statistics on solidary publishing partnerships in the various networks perhaps even an impact assessment of the relevance of these practices.
